Sunday 17th May

Starting from Devoran, nr Truro



167km
Start 8:30
£6 entry

The Granite and Serpentine Way is a 100 miler featuring a wide variety of classic Cornish scenery with long coastal stretches and views out to sea as well as sheltered lanes and the open plateau of the Lizard. This ride provides a very approachable step up to riding a hundred miles in Cornwall.



106km

A Lizard Loop begins with a ride through the lanes to Little Pengelly Tea Room, the commercial control used on all three events. The route then takes a run down the Lizard peninsula and back, making the most of its open, flatter roads and distinctive terrain.

Carns and Killas uses quiet lanes and minor roads to ride out to the Little Pengelly control and then loop back to Devoran.
