A Cornish 100 A popular event organised by Falmouth Wheelers. A cross country ride starts with a circuit of Falmouth beaches and then heads out to Gweek and across to the edge of Camborne. Then down to Marazion and views of St Michaels Mount. Back via Porthleven, to the usual refreshments.

A Bunny Hop offers an excellent introduction to Audax riding, as well as appealing to those who prefer a gentler profile, a shorter route, or a chance of a longer tea.

Starting from The Perranwell Centre

Lizard and the Camel Ascent is modest for a 200 in Cornwall but the route is scenic in the literal sense. Controls at Lizard Village, Gwithian and Padstow. The Camel Trail is used for a 21km section but an all-tarmac alternative is offered. This event offers a straightforward introduction to randonneur distance.

Red River Blue Sea An uncomplicated trip to the far West, starting with a ride out to the mouth of the Red River at Gwithian, followed by a loop via Marazion and the high Atlantic cliff road past Zennor before returning from Gwithian to Perranwell via Portreath and Skinner's Bottom.

Peter's Point A straightforward ride out to Gwithian, returning along the north coast to Portreath then turning south through Skinner's Bottom to return to Perranwell.


