Starting from The Perranwell Centre

Lizard and the Camel Ascent is modest for a 200 in Cornwall but the route is scenic in the literal sense. Controls at Lizard Village, Gwithian and Padstow. This route is a good introduction to riding randonneur distance.

Red River Blue Sea An uncomplicated trip to the far West, starting with a ride out to the mouth of the Red River at Gwithian, followed by a loop via Marazion and the high Atlantic cliff road past Zennor before returning from Gwithian to Perranwell via Portreath and Skinner's Bottom.

Peter's Point A straightforward ride out to Gwithian, returning along the north coast to Portreath then turning south through Skinner's Bottom and back to Perranwell.

Free refreshments at Perranwell and Gwithian on all rides.
